**RESIDENCE REQUIREMENTS:** CANDIDATES MUST HAVE BEEN LEGAL RESIDENTS OF ERIE COUNTY FOR AT LEAST ONE MONTH IMMEDIATELY PRECEDING THE DATE OF THE WRITTEN TEST AND MUST BE LEGAL RESIDENTS OF ERIE COUNTY AT THE TIME OF APPOINTMENT. At present there are five vacancies in the Department of Social Services and one regular part-time vacancy (\$18.21 - \$24.00 per hour).

A promotion examination will be held at the same time as this examination. The list resulting from the promotion examination will be used first but appointments from this open competitive examination are anticipated. Use of the list may be suspended after it is one year old for any position which it is practical to fill through a new promotion examination.

**MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS:** Candidates must meet one of the following requirements on or before March 21, 2009:

- A) Graduation from a regionally accredited or New York State registered college or university with a Master's Degree in Social Work and one year of experience in child protective casework or child and family social work with a public or private social agency adhering to acceptable standards; or:
- B) Graduation from a regionally accredited or New York State registered college or university with a Bachelor's Degree in Social Work or Human Service and two years of full-time paid experience in child welfare or related case work with a public or private social agency adhering to acceptable standards; or:
- C) An equivalent combination of training and experience as defined by the limits of (A) and (B).

**SPECIAL REQUIREMENTS:** 1.) Eligibility for New York State Driver's License at the time of application. Possession of the License and use of a private automobile at time of appointment. 2.) Section 424-a of the Social Services Law requires the local social services district to inquire whether the applicant is the subject of an indicated child abuse or maltreatment report on file with the State Central Register of Child Abuse and Maltreatment. All potential employees for this position will be requested to sign the necessary clearance form prior to being advised that they will be hired. Refusal to sign will be cause for an automatic non-selection.

**NOTES:** 1.) Human Services includes the following disciplines: Education, criminal justice, social work, psychology, gerontology and vocational and/or psychological counseling, as well as therapeutic modalities such occupational therapy, physical therapy, and therapeutic recreation. It does not include natural sciences, business, or liberal arts. 2.) Verifiable part-time and/or volunteer experience will be pro-rated toward meeting the experience requirements. 3.) Your degree and/or college credit must have been awarded by a regionally accredited college or university or one recognized by the New York State Education Department as following acceptable educational practices. A grade of "D" or better is necessary for a course to be credited as successfully completed. If your degree and/or college credit was awarded by an educational institution outside of the United States and its territories, you must provide independent verification of equivalency. You can write to this Department for a list of acceptable companies providing this service; you must pay the required evaluation fee.

**NOTICE:** Erie County no longer maintains a file of applicant transcripts. Exam applicants must be prepared to provide documentation of educational qualifications (transcript, diploma, etc.) to the hiring agency prior to appointment. Documentation may also be submitted with the exam application.

**DUTIES:** A *Social Caseworker II* interviews applicants/clients and provides or makes referrals for child care, foster care, adoption, preventive or other services of the department and makes field investigations to verify information and to ascertain need child welfare services; reviews existing case records for information to formulate a service plan; makes necessary collateral contacts, relatives, friends, physicians, hospitals and other social service agencies; assesses safety and risk of children; formulates and carries out plans for assistance and/or service; documents case records; (continued on reverse)

A medical examination may be required before appointment.

**DUTIES:** (continued) writes letters and reports; makes assignments of work for caseworkers; aids individual caseworkers in formulating service and work organization plans; acts as consultant on child welfare problems to public assistance staff and Family Court; specializes in child welfare services or specific areas; may be required to work with Spanish speaking clients/cases if originally appointed from the Caseworker (Spanish Speaking list); develops plan for investigating reported cases of child abuse and neglect based on reported information; initiates investigations by contacting relatives, neighbors, collateral service agencies, conducting home visits and interviewing the child, parents and others; assess safety and risk; evaluates the seriousness of the situation and, when necessary, initiates prompt protective action to ensure the safety of the child; provides information for petitioning Family Court when a court order is required to protect the safety of the child; may provide supportive counseling to the child and the family; may speak to community groups and organizations on child protective services.

**SUBJECTS OF EXAMINATION:** A written test designed to evaluate knowledge, skills and /or abilities in the following areas:

1. **CASE SUPERVISION** - These questions present descriptions of problems and situations in employee-supervisor or employee-client relationships typically encountered in the supervision of employees who deal with client caseloads. The situations and/or problems presented will include, but not necessarily be limited to, (1) administrative issues such as planning and assigning cases, (2) developing employees' competence in casework through discussion of problem cases, and (3) helping employees deal with job-related stress.
2. **LAWS, RULES, REGULATIONS AND CONCEPTS RELATED TO CHILD ABUSE AND NEGLECT** - These questions test both for a knowledge of New York State law, policies, and administrative directives related to child abuse and neglect and for a knowledge of the standard concepts, behaviors, and indicators, including risk assessment, which enable a worker to determine that abuse or neglect has occurred.
3. **EVALUATING CONCLUSIONS IN LIGHT OF KNOWN FACTS** - These questions will consist of a set of facts and a conclusion. You must decide if the conclusion is proved by the facts, disproved by the facts or if the facts are not sufficient to prove or disprove the conclusion. The questions will not be specific to a particular field.
4. **PREPARING WRITTEN MATERIAL** - These questions test for the ability to present information clearly and accurately, and to organize paragraphs logically and comprehensibly. For some questions, you will be given information in two or three sentences followed by four restatements of the information. You must then choose the best version. For other questions, you will be given paragraphs with their sentences out of order. You must then choose, from four suggestions, the best order for the sentences.
5. **SUPERVISION** - These questions test for knowledge of the principles and practices employed in planning, organizing, and controlling the activities of a work unit toward predetermined objectives. The concepts covered, usually in a situational question format, include such topics as assigning and reviewing work; evaluating performance; maintaining work standards; motivating and developing subordinates; implementing procedural change; increasing efficiency; and dealing with problems of absenteeism, morale, and discipline.
6. **UNDERSTANDING AND RECOGNIZING THE DYNAMICS AND EFFECTS OF CHILD ABUSE AND NEGLECT** - These questions test for a knowledge of standard concepts, behaviors, and indicators that enable the worker to determine or establish that abuse or neglect has occurred. The questions deal with basic laws and techniques for dealing with the abused or neglected child and his or her family and follow-up, referral, or other action to take once abuse or neglect has been identified.

**NOTICE TO CANDIDATES:** Unless otherwise noted, candidates are permitted to use quiet, hand held, solar or battery powered calculators. Devices with typewriter keyboards, "Spell Checkers", "Personal Digital Assistants", "Address Books", "Language Translators", "Dictionaries", or any similar devices are prohibited. You may not bring books or other reference materials.

**APPLICATION FORMS:** You may obtain these forms in person at the Erie County Personnel Department, Rath County Office Building, 95 Franklin St., Buffalo, NY. Forms are also available in the libraries and at Town, Village and School District administrative offices.

Mail your application form when completed to the Erie County Department of Personnel, 95 Franklin St., Buffalo, NY 14202.

Candidates who submit incomplete applications and documentation may be disqualified. The Erie County Department of Personnel reserves the right to reject for lateness or to accept applications filed after the advertised filing period.

**MILITARY STATUS:** Active duty military personnel may file an application for this exam. A special military make-up examination will be conducted for any member of the armed forces of the United States who has duly filed a timely application but who was deprived of the opportunity to compete in the scheduled exam due to active military duty. Special conditions apply to these requests and may be reviewed at the Erie County Department of Personnel.

**VETERANS:** Disabled and non-disabled veterans as defined in Section 85, New York State Civil Service Law, will have 10 and 5 points, respectively added to their earned scores if successful in the examination. You must claim these credits when you file application but you have an option to waive them any time prior to appointment. If you have already used these credits for a permanent position in NYS, you may not claim them again.

In conformance with section 85-a of the Civil Service Law, **CHILDREN OF FIREFIGHTERS AND POLICE OFFICERS KILLED IN THE LINE OF DUTY** shall be entitled to receive an additional ten points in a competitive examination for original appointment in the same municipality in which his or her parent has served. If you are qualified to participate in this examination and are a child of a firefighter or police officer killed in the line of duty in this municipality, please inform this office of this matter when you submit your application for examination. A candidate claiming such credit has a minimum of two months from the application deadline to provide the necessary documentation to verify additional credit eligibility. However, no credit may be added after the eligible list has been established.

**APPLYING FOR EXAMINATIONS IN MULTIPLE JURISDICTIONS ON SAME DATE.** If you have applied for any other Civil Service exams for employment with New York State or any other local government jurisdiction, you must make arrangement to take all the exams at one test site.

If you have applied for both State and Local government exams, you must make arrangements to take all your exams at the State exam center by calling 1-877-NYS-JOBS (1-877-697-5627) no later than two weeks before the test date.

If you have applied for other local government exams, call or write each Civil Service Agency to make arrangements. You must make your request for these arrangements no later than three weeks before the date of the exams. You must notify all local government civil service agencies with whom you have filed an application of the location at which you wish to take your exam(s). **ADMISSION TO EXAMINATION:** Notice to appear for the test will be conditional as review of application for minimum requirements may not be made until after the written test. Call or write this Department if you have not received your notice 3 days before the date of the test. You may not be admitted to the examination room without official notice.

**SPECIAL ARRANGEMENTS:** Applicants whose religious beliefs prevent their taking examinations before sundown on Saturday and physically handicapped candidates who require special examination facilities should so inform the Erie County Department of Personnel, by a separately mailed letter at the earliest possible date before the test.

**RATINGS REQUIRED:** Tests are rated on a scale of 100 with a passing mark at 70. Unless the announcement states otherwise, you must pass the written test and the oral test, if any. Test instructions may further divide the tests into parts and set minimum standards for each part.

**TRAINING AND EXPERIENCE:** If a subject of the examination, training and experience may not be rated if all passing candidates are expected to be immediately reachable for appointment. If rated, training and experience will be based on the statements in your application subject to verification. If this examination includes a qualifying written test, candidates admitted to the test will have conditional approval only. Final decision regarding the qualifications of candidates rests with the New York State Department of Civil Service.

**VERIFICATION OF QUALIFICATIONS:** Candidates may be investigated or called for an interview to verify information contained on the application.

**Verifiable** part-time and/or volunteer experience may be pro-rated toward meeting full-time experience requirements.

**MEDICAL EXAMINATION:** You may be required to take a medical examination to determine if you are medically and physically capable of performing the duties of the position.

In accordance with State Law, Governor's Executive Order 6, and Section 504 of the Federal Rehabilitation Act of 1973, as amended the County of Erie does not discriminate against handicapped persons in access to employment, during employment, or in any of its programs and activities.

**ELIGIBLE LIST:** The eligible list resulting from an examination may also be used for appointment to the same title or to any other title deemed to be similar and appropriate. Eligible lists are active for a minimum of one year and a maximum of four years from the date established.

**Background Investigation:** Applicants may be required to undergo a State and national criminal history background investigation, which will include a fingerprint check, to determine suitability for appointment. Failure to meet the standards for the background investigation may result in disqualification. Applicants may be required to pay a fee for the investigation.

**NOTE:** Fingerprints are sometimes required at the time of appointment. When they are required, the fee involved must be paid by the appointee.

**\*\*IMPORTANT APPLICATION FEE - READ CAREFULLY\*\***

A \$20.00 filing fee is required for this exam. The required fee must accompany your application. Send or bring check or money order made payable to Erie County Personnel Department and write the examination number(s) on your check or money order. Do not send or bring cash, as the County cannot be responsible for cash payment. As no refund will be made, you are urged to compare your qualifications carefully with the requirements for admission and file only for those examinations for which you are clearly qualified.

**APPLICATION FEE WAIVER:** A waiver of application fee will be allowed if you are unemployed and primarily responsible for the support of a household. In addition, a waiver of application fee will be allowed if you are determined eligible for Medicaid, or receiving Supplemental Security Income payments, or Public Assistance (Temporary Assistance for Needy Families/Family Assistance or Safety Net Assistance) or are certified Job Training Partnership Act/Workforce Investment Act eligible through a State or local social service agency.

All claims for application fee waiver are subject to verification. If you can verify eligibility for application fee waiver, complete a "Request for Application Fee Waiver and Certification: form and submit it with your application by the close of business on the Application Deadline as listed on the Examination Announcement.
